- ➤ NSR Litigation Opening Briefs schedule was extended slightly MDAQMD filed our brief on Oct. 16th, EPA reply brief is due December 18th.
- ➤ CIP Updates Completed additional security updates that include additional security cameras and key card entry ways from Stone Security. East end bathrooms done, completed water damage repair on west end of operations, and completed exterior patio demo and reconfiguration.
- Solar project replacement bids came in and we are proceeding to review. Also, expect to get a new roof replacement bid, that would take place sometime in future after the existing solar is removed from the roof.
- As part of sprucing up the Board chambers, replaced old wall décor and put new photos up in frames, painted the wood trim on dais, and as you can see put our mission statement on the wall and representative seats on the Board. Thanks to Robyn, Michelle, Deanna and Martial.
- > Other Legislation updates:
 - O State session ended and the governor had until Oct. 14th to sign or veto bills. Many of the 2-year bills will be brought back up at the beginning of the session as well as a few bills that died will most likely get reintroduced in some form.
 - Federal govt. avoided a shutdown with a CR on Sept. 30th, to temporarily keep government operating through Nov.14th, there will be much more to come.
