Miscellaneous:

❖ Welcome new Needles Alternate Board member – Henry Longbrake.

- ❖ Congratulations to Supervisor Manuel Perez for being named to the California Air Resources Board of Directors. Had his first CARB meeting on Feb. 23rd where CARB approved the MDAQMD recently adopted 70 ppb Ozone SIP.
- ❖ Deadline to introduce new legislation was Feb. 17th; over 2,000 new bills were introduced for this session. A few to note:
 - Sent out information on AB627 (Jackson) that was introduced that has prohibitory language to not allow diesel trucks on city or county roadways in Riverside and San Bernardino Counties by Jan. 1. 2030.
 - o AB 1609 (Garcia) Spot bill related to air district DMV fees.
 - SB 563 (Archuletta) South Coast sponsored bill designating air districts as independent special districts for purposes of receiving state funds or funds disbursed by the state, including federal funds.
- ❖ CARB Board hearing February 23rd CARB Board approved the MDAQMD 2015 70 ppb Ozone SIP, next they ship it up to EPA.
- ❖ We issued two air quality advisories for windblown dust on Feb. 14 and 21. We had exceptionally high social media engagement from posts sharing the advisories including numerous shares from board members, our jurisdictional cities and partner agencies.
- Advisories were sent out through our digital mailing list, which now has just shy of 12,000 subscribers.
- ❖ We boosted a post for three days beginning Feb. 13 for our parking lot fencing project request for bids. The post was seen by nearly 4,000 different users on Facebook and helped draw participation in the site walk-through on Feb. 16.

Mr. Poiriez updated the Board of past events:

- ➤ Jan. 26th attended CARB Board meeting in Riverside, where the CARB Board and myself recognized Ms. Barbara Riordan for her many years of service towards advancing clean air.
- ➤ Jan. 31st call with AAPCA Executive Director to strategize on topics of interest for 2023.
- ➤ Feb. 1st & 2nd CAPCOA virtual monthly meeting discussed/planning for DC Advocacy trip, Environmental Justice (EJ) efforts, CAPCOA resources, PM NAAQS calls planned, Spring Meeting Agenda.
- Feb. 6^{th} -9th CAPCOA DC Advocacy Trip. Here are some of the agencies and representatives I met with: Federal Rail Administration – specifically talking impacts of rail emissions and trying to secure funding from the Bipartisan Infrastructure Legislation (BIL) and Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) for incentive and implementation programs in California. The Barstow current and planned facilities were discussed. Congressman Aguilar office thank him for support of appropriations for programs like Targeted Air Grants (TAG), DERA, and section 103/105 which the MDAQMD has benefited from greatly over the past several years. Impactions of nonattainment (sanctions), Need Federal Action – them to do their jobs on mobile sector within their jurisdiction – rail, planes, ships, heavy duty vehicles (common theme in all meetings). Explained there needs to be a Whole of the Government approach – involve us local air districts along the entire processes in a meaningful manner (cooperative federalism) – again common theme in all meetings. Meeting and lunch with NACAA Executive and staff, met with Senator Feinstein office, met with White House Office of Environmental Quality and Environmental Justice, met with Senator Ruiz staff – thanked them for their efforts to secure money for the Salton Sea (which dry lake PM emissions impact the entire southwest), challenges with EPA and their current processes,

need for additional funds locally for air programs, brought up the recently announced closure of the Chuckwalla prison in Blythe that Board Member DeConinck is dealing with, and current status of MDAQMD NSR rule with EPA, proposed Good Neighbor Ozone FIP and those impacts in MD and the potential of sanctions and what that means.

Met with <u>U.S. EPA Office of Air and Radiation and their Senior Leadership including Joe Goffman, Tomas Carbonell, Scott Mathias</u> and others – many of the same themes as above but putting them on notice that we do not feel like a partner with EPA, and more needs to be done in this arena, need them to step up their efforts in their jurisdiction instead of just hammering the stationary sectors when most of the emissions inventories are from the mobile sector which is their responsibility. Met with <u>Speaker Kevin McCarthy office and Deputy Chief of Staff – Kyle Lombardi;</u> met with our <u>Congressman Jay Obernolte</u> on all the issues previously stated and this was one of the best meetings – the Congressman is willing to assist wherever and whenever he can to address EPA concerns we shared – rather it be writing letters or requesting congressional hearing. We will stay in constant contact with his office as the issues flush out. Also, met with <u>Representative Zoe Lofgren's Senior Policy staff</u>. And many more ancillary meetings. Overall, a positive trip.

- ➤ Feb. 13th met with EPA Region 9 Senior Management for first quarterly meeting to go over NSR rule deadlines, Transport FIP timelines, 2015 Ozone SIP, several other EPA rule actions pending they are working on in some stage about 9 different rules covered.
- ➤ Feb. 14th Initial introductory call with CARB staff and Districts with Cement Facilities relating to strategies on SB596 Net Zero Cement emission reductions. CCMEC and their consultants supported the legislation and according to CARB continue to support it and are working with CARB.
- Feb.16th A preconference Bid meeting was held for the North Parking lot security project that is out to bid and the bids are due on Feb. 24th.
- Feb.23rd 24th Attended the Medium Section APCO meeting in Bakersfield.
